drupa 2012 – a successful show

Despite all prophecies of doom, drupa 2012 turned out to be highly successful for Baumann-Wohlenberg. Consistently throughout the show, crowds of visitors from Germany and abroad came to have a look at the three cutting systems, installed



on the Baumann-Wohlenberg stand. Also met with great approval was the pile counting and tabbing machine, which was developed by BAUMANN Maschinenbau Solms in cooperation with the counting system specialist GTS from Heilbronn (Germany). As a result, many new projects emerged, some of them even becoming

firm orders at the show. On the very first day of drupa 2012, a leading web offset and media services provider in Germany bought a fully equipped No 3 system including the completely automatic jogging system BASA. Cutting system No 3 combines several automated components for highest production demands, but, at the same time relieves the operator of physical strain.

In addition, Cutting System No 2, which was on display at drupa 2012, was bought right from the Baumann-Wohlenberg stand. Cutting system No 2 offers high productivity in combination with perfect ergonomics. It is equipped with an automatic cutting device and its low investment level makes it extremely cost effective. Equipped with a newly designed front table feeding system, it delivers highly accurate and high-quality cutting results.

Blumer AG from Switzerland, another cooperation partner of Baumann-Wohlenberg's and sited adjacent to the main Baumann-Wohlenberg stand, exhibited a system for both square and shaped label production.

From 10 to 12 September 2012, Baumann-Wohlenberg offers its customers again the possibility to gather information about Cutting System No. 2 during a "mini open house" at the cutting centre in Solms-Niederbiehl.
